

## New Principals Announced at Central Catholic and Holy Cross Central

After a national search, the Archdiocese of Indianapolis has announced that Ruth Hurrle will be the next principal of Central Catholic School and Matthew Gring will be the next principal of Holy Cross Central Catholic School. Central Catholic and Holy Cross are Notre Dame ACE Academies in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis.

Hurrle will begin at Central Catholic on June 12. She has worked in Indiana schools for 21 years and is currently the dean of students at Stonybrook Intermediate Academy. Prior to her time at Stonybrook, she was the assistant principal at George Washington Community High School in Indianapolis and the dean of students at Center Grove Middle School North in Greenwood and Columbus North High School in Columbus. She has also taught math and science at the Indiana Online Academy, Speedway Junior High School in Speedway, and Roncalli High School and M.S.D. Perry Township in Indianapolis. Hurrle earned a bachelor's degree in earth and space science education from Purdue University and a master's degree in educational leadership from Indiana University.

Gring will begin at Holy Cross on June 26. He is currently the vice principal at Sacred Heart Catholic School in Pinellas Park, Florida. Like Holy Cross, Sacred Heart is a Notre Dame ACE Academy. Prior to serving as vice principal, Gring taught religion to third-graders and social studies and religion to middle school students at St. Ambrose Catholic School in Tucson, Arizona. He also worked there as a coach, athletic director, liturgical coordinator, and chair of the school culture professional learning community. Gring earned a bachelor's degree in political science and master's degrees in education and educational leadership from the University of Notre Dame.

Central Catholic School and Holy Cross Central are Notre Dame ACE Academies in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. The Notre Dame ACE Academies are a national network of schools operated in partnerships between the University of Notre Dame and (arch)dioceses that focus on continuous improvement in teaching and learning, Catholic school culture, and financial sustainability.
